Undergraduate research will involve web searches that lead to assembling reviews of ongoing academic centers, projects, and reports regarding how to reform global capitalism. Research will also involve identifying scholarship published in the last 5 years that recommends how to update the global economic system, including information about authors and one-page summaries of the books. The undergraduate researcher will also be invited to participate in the Spring 2025 research group activities.
